



Éamonn Ó Meachair, 19 years of age, is a piper from Doire'n Chuilinn, Cúíl Aodha. He is the youngest in a family of five, all of whom are musicians. Music was always a huge part of the family home.

He began playing the Uilleann Pipes at age 7 through Na Píobairí Uilleann "Pipes on Loan" scheme. His first tutor was Rob Fell in the Killarney School of Music. At Scoil Samhraidh Willie Clancy he has had tutors

## The Loss of a Friend in John O'Looney, Quartermire, Mullagh, Co. Clare

The sad news of John O'Looney's passing swept rapidly through traditional music circles early on the morning of October 26th 2002.

The ink was literally drying on last year's festival brochures and they hadn't yet been distributed throughout the town when we got the news that one of our greatest supporters had gone to his eternal reward.

Only the previous night there was a festival committee check-list meeting and on that list was a matter of verification that there was a room held for John O'Looney at the River Island Hotel - and there was.

There was a strange sense of appropriateness about his going from his home in Quartermire then as he would be departing at that time of year anyway on his way to Castleisland for the Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festival – as he had done every year, bar one, since 1993 – and the one was that in the Covid lock-down era.

Over many of those years he would have been accompanied by his, Knocknagoshel native, late wife Joan who passed away in January 2010. Once you saw them and the late Susie Cox and their equals you knew the weekend had arrived.

We knew he hadn't been feeling well during the summer but then the news filtered around that the festival committee here had reserved a room in the River Island Hotel for him and his son Aidan for the weekend.

A solid judge of good music, John's first job on arriving in Castleisland would be to know where to go over the weekend and his well thumbed festival programme would earn its keep for the duration.

In all the years I knew him I never heard him say a bad word about anyone.

On one occasion he couldn't find Danny O'Mahony on the programme or in the pub, and I suggested an alternative. With raised eyebrows, he made a face at me, spread the fingers of a big hand and, with a downward motion, left me in no doubt that my suggestion didn't quite make the grade.

He was a great friend of the Kerry native and adopted Clare man the late Muiris Ó Rócháin – one of the founder members of the world renowned, Miltown Malbay based, Willie Clancy Summer School.

John O'Looney knew Willie Clancy and had seen all the greats of Irish music at close quarters down through the years.

John, who would have been 84 last January, was a well equipped and valued advisor to the late Mike Kenny in the early days of the Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festival from 1993 on and great company always.

We celebrated with a proud John on a festival weekend after St. Joseph's GAA Club won the Clare senior football championship in 2015 for the first time in a quarter of a century.

And also on a Sunday afternoon in 2018 here in Castleisland after his grandsons, Cormac and Micheál Murray and Óisín O'Looney helped Miltown Malbay to win the championship title again.

For that game he and many others from Miltown Malbay left Castleisland in mid morning and were back here again before the peals of the Angelus bells that evening.

We miss his humorous honesty, his warmth and knowledge - all hallmarks that endeared us to his engaging company over all those years.

The numbers of Castleisland and Kerry people that crossed the Shannon for his funeral services in St. Mary's Church in Mullagh on the Friday evening and Saturday morning left no doubt about his status in the circles in which he moved so easily, so knowledgeably and so quietly.

There is an unmarked but fitting monument to John O'Looney in the corner of the snug in Friel's Bar in Miltown Malbay.

It's a barrel covered with a cushion in a strategic location. It's ideally placed for the keen follower of the tune and close enough to the corner of the bar from where the pint can be called for with a minimum of fuss or movement.

In the course of his time among us nobody else sat there. There may have been times when it would be kept warm for a while but, much like the late Garda John Moloney (another Clare man) in Brennan's Bar here in Castleisland, when they appeared the temporary occupants respectfully vacated.

John O'Looney's first anniversary Mass will be celebrated at St. Mary's Church, Mullagh on Friday, November 17th at 7:30pm.

May God be good to him. - John Reidy

# The Late Jimmy Doyle ~ One of the Most (harismatic of Our (herished Musicians

News of the death of Jimmy Doyle, Maulykevane, Headford, Killarney on Sunday, January 8th. 2023 was greeted throughout the world of traditional Irish music with the kind of sadness you'd associate with the loss of a friend.

Jimmy Doyle was one of the most charismatic of Kerry's cherished musicians of the Sliabh Luachra tradition. He was featured on many radio and television programmes in the course of his life.

He had a Céilí House special on RTÉ Radio One dedicated to him and his music broadcast in early August 2009.

The programme was recorded in Fagin's / Hartnett's Bar here in Castleisland on the previous April with a host of musicians and singers in attendance.

Jimmy was also the recipient of the Dedication to the Music of Sliabh Luachra Award at the 2009 Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festival.

In that he joined a list of the genre's finest exponents and promoters: like: Paddy Cronin, Mikey Duggan, Denis McMahon, Johnny O'Leary, Nicky and Anne McAuliffe, Paddy Jones and broadcasters, Peter Browne and Ciarán Mac Mathúna and many more.

The Scartaglin based Handed Down rolling programme of local music and culture also dedicated one of its Saturday night slots to Jimmy in April 2017.

This took the form of an interview conducted by one of his great admirers and an equally accomplished accordion player, Bryan O'Leary.

His loss, and that of the late Séamus Begley only a day apart in the darkness of January 2023 was widely mourned and will be sadly felt by the generations lucky enough to have seen and heard them entertaining and performing.

There will be those among generations to come who will praise and thank them for the considerable contributions they made to the health and well-being of the music they loved and played while they could. May God be good to them. - John Reidy

# The Late Séamus Ó Beaglaoich ~ A Universally Shared Sadness at his Passing

The shock news of the unexpected death on January 9th 2023 of Séamus Ó Beaglaoich caught the world of traditional Irish music in its sharp glare as the shock slowly gave way to a deep and almost worldwide sadness.

Worldwide, because he was known the world over and loved for his sense of fun and mischievousness.

Further evidence of his widespread appeal came in the shape of the tributes that were paid to him after the news hit home and away.

There were obituaries and tributes in every possible publication here at home and in US based news-agencies with regional offices in places throughout the world.

Here in Ireland there wasn't a paper to be found that didn't carry the sad news or a tribute; count in The Farmers Journal which reflected an equally important part of his life.

One Sunday morning in March 2013 Miriam O'Callaghan interviewed the Baile na bPoc, Ballydavid musicians and brothers Breanndán and the late Séamus Begley.

In the course of the programme the talented duo recalled their childhood in West Kerry where they lived on the family farm and the household included their grandparents, parents and the nine children.

They told Miriam that it was a life of hard work. They recall the arrival of electricity, radio and the neighbour's first television set and they discussed how music was extremely important in the family and how their father ran the local dance hall.

This encouraged them to learn tunes on the accordion so that they might play there.

Séamus began playing the accordion there while a schoolboy and Brendán played the drums. Their mother was a great singer.

Séamus explained how he hated farming and when his musical career took off he said that farmers didn't consider him to be a proper farmer and musicians didn't consider him to be a proper musician.

As the wide world of traditional music mourned for the man so many of its inhabitants claim as a friend, the people of his area of West Kerry braced themselves for an influx of people wishing to express their condolences to his wife Máire and their family and extended family.

It came and they dealt with it through the power of the music he lived his life for.

He was here in Castleisland with us this time last year in roguish good form and he played a blinder with his daughter Méabh in a massive session at Fagin's / Hartnett's Bar on the Sunday afternoon of the festival.

May God be good to him. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a anam. - John Reidy

## Altan and Mairéad Looking Forward to Visiting and Playing at Castleisland Festival

A no holds barred estimate of the popularity of the band Altan on audiences throughout the world suggests that no Irish traditional music band has had a wider impact on music lovers from Donegal to Tokyo to Seattle.

Now the members of Altan are preparing for their first visit to Castleisland on October 29th to play in the 31st Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festival.

The band members understand instinctively well what a musical legacy in an area like Castleisland means to those open to the calling.

They live their lives and play their music influenced, inspired and surrounded by the Doherty and McLaughlin legacies of their area of Donegal.

Just like our great musicians down here pay homage, praise them while they can, the richness of what Patrick O'Keeffe and his equals handed down, gave and gifted to them to mind.

Altan will understand what drives the scene in Kerry and in Castleisland for those few mad musical days of togetherness and all the ordinary days that sacrifice themselves for those that really matter.

Kerry and Castleisland have not been anything like frequent hunting grounds for the Donegal based band over the years.

In the course of a telephone chat with Mairéad Ní Mhaonaigh recently, I was taken aback and my innocence exposed by her response when I mentioned to her the infrequency of the band's appearances down here since it was formed back in the early 1980s.

After expressing her and the band's delight at the opportunity to play at the Castleisland festival she explained in rational if seldom heard terms why appearances in Ireland generally are such a rarity.

"We're delighted to be coming down to play in County Kerry and we can't wait to be honest with you. You mention that we're not down in Kerry too often, the thing about playing traditional music in Ireland is that it's very difficult to get gigs anywhere in the country for traditional musicians or a traditional band," said Mairéad.

"The irony of it all is that, unless we're playing at festivals around the country it's very hard for us to make a living here in Ireland and we have to leave to do that. And that's why we're looking forward to playing in Castleisland. It's so lovely when we do get the chance to play a gig here and there in Ireland when we can – because it's a rarity in fairness," she said.

"It's strange in a way because we have such a strong tradition of great music in Ireland and yet it's so hard to get an audience to come out to hear traditional music in Ireland – unless it's at a festival.

"Look at The Chieftains and many other bands like them – we all have to leave Ireland to make a living. That's the way it is here and it would be fabulous if we could stay at home and make a living here. But we're delighted to be coming down to Kerry and getting the chance to play there," she added.

"God bless festivals then? I offered – and she wholeheartedly agreed.

Altan, the name of the band, was taken from a deep and mysterious lake behind Errigal Mountain up in Co. Donegal.

Down here in Co. Kerry this weekend, however, there's no mystery at all in getting to see this truly magnificent band in concert in Castleisland the River Island Hotel on Sunday, October 29th. from 8pm. - John Reidy









## A Goldmine of Sliabh Luachra Music from Castleisland in 1956 Recording

A veritable goldmine of old, traditional and very local music will be opened up to the public courtesy of the Handed Down Sliabh Luachra Archives at the Ivy Leaf Art Centre in Castleisland on Sunday, October 29th at 5:30pm.

An offer from the Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festival committee in September to highlight the collection in the online Handed Down Sliabh Luachra Archive was 'gratefully accepted' by its founder P.J. Teahan.

PJ is also to receive the 2023 Dedication to the Music of Sliabh Luachra award in the course of the long weekend of this festival which runs over its recently adopted five-day duration from Thursday, October 26th to and including Monday 30th. 2023 and, as sure as you're there, a small sup of Tuesday.

PJ revealed that 2023 has been one of the best years for materials being donated to the archives and the opportunity to highlight these was too good an offer to turn down.

Early last spring saw the arrival of 20 cassette tapes from the USA from the family of Kathleen Fitzgerald R.I.P originally from Lisheen Cross and the famous Waiver Murphy family feature on these tapes," said PJ with more than a hint of what he's about to unveil.

"Fortunately for those of us who treasure such material, Kerry ETB in Tralee listened to our proposals and stepped forward with funding to save and preserve these tapes so that future generations of young traditional musicians could listed to and learn from them," said PJ.

"We're delighted to have the legendary Nickie McAuliffe launch this collection on Sunday, October 29th.

"As often happens when your luck is in, you get more good news. An email from Richie Piggott in Chicago brought tidings of great joy. He wished to donate 28 pieces of music and song to the archives that were recorded in 1956 by Terry 'Cuz' Teahan of Glountane. The recordings were made in the Tobermaing, Castleisland home of his brother Paddy Teahan," PJ added with delight and wonder at the discovery of the recordings made in his grand-father's house so long ago.

"It will be an exciting and historic occasion for devotees of the music and visitors to the Castleisland festival to hear the fiddle-master Patrick O'Keeffe playing solo and with his three former pupils: Cuz Teahan home from Chicago; Jerry McCarthy and Timmy Spillane from Gortgloss, Scartaglin.

They are joined on the recording by Castleisland singer and later band leader, Michael O'Callaghan in fine and impressive voice with Scartaglin saxophonist Ger O'Sullivan.

The launch will also hear music from a Céilí House recording at Brennan's Bar, in Castleisland from November 2002.

There's a radio special on Nickie and Anne McAuliffe and one with wise words from Paddy Jones R.I.P and a Kenmare recording from the 80s of Jackie Daly's brilliance on the box.

"It will be a great evening and a memorable occasion for Castleisland to hear the magic of Patrick O'Keeffe on fiddle during the festival which honours his memory and his music," said PJ.

It's all very much in keeping with the 'Mind your Music' advice given by the late Dr. Ciarán Mac Mathúna when he and his colleague Peter Browne launched the RTÉ Radio 1 CD of the music of the last of the great fiddle masters himself.

That was in the Crown Hotel on the Sunday evening of the first festival in 1993 all of 30 years ago to the day of PJ's launch this weekend. - John Reidy


